Disciplinary Action Taken by the Board

IN THE MATTER OF BRIAN SCHALLER, P.E.

Summary:

In November 2010, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions received a Report of Alleged Violation from one of its licensed engineers in which it was indicated that Mr. Schaller had been employed by an engineering firm in Kansas and that following Mr. Schaller's departure from the company, other engineers reviewed some of Mr. Schaller's work which caused them to have concerns about his technical competence regarding some projects that he had worked on.

Disclaimer: Every effort has been made to ensure that the following enforcement information is correct: however. this information should not be relied upon without verification from the Kansas board office. It should be noted that the names of companies and individuals listed may be similar to the names of parties who have not had enforcement actions taken against them. Disciplinary orders are public information and copies may be obtained by contacting the board office.

Board Action:

Following the completion of an investigation and a determination by the Board's investigator, it was determined that Mr. Schaller had deviated from generally accepted engineering standards and practices in the preparation of plans and specifications for the construction and remediation for a new high school. Said deviations included:

A. The original design was deficient in that it did not identify and provide support for the lateral loads in an area of the building.

B. The roof included sky lights and a change in elevation from the outside of the building to the interior. This provided complication for carrying the lateral loads from the outside roof diaphragm of the building to the interior diaphragm and subsequently to masonry shear walls. There was no provision made in the original design to carry horizontal loads to competent resisting members.

C. The exterior masonry wall west of corridor C154 had no structural system to resist overturning forces such as wind.

D. The exterior wall of several rooms was attached to the roof diaphragm but the roof changes elevations at the other side of these rooms, so the roof was not able to transfer a lateral load to component shear walls.

E. The east wall extends above the high roof and is about 30 feet high. There

was no significant lateral load resistance provided in the original structural design.

F. The original design was prepared by subordinates of Brian Schaller and the designer failed to identify the load path required to resist the lateral loads and did not identify the structural elements required to resist them.

As a result of the foregoing determinations, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions and Brian Schaller entered into a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order which included the following:

Mr. Schaller, admitted that he deviated from generally accepted engineering standards as set out above.

Mr. Schaller, shall pay a civil fine and costs totaling \$5,000.00.

Mr. Schaller shall forthwith conform his engineering practices to meet generally accepted engineering standards and/or practices.

Status:

At the request of Mr. Schaller, the Board agreed to allow the fine and costs to be paid in installments beginning August 1, 2012. To date, Mr. Schaller is current in making those payments.

IN THE MATTER OF NORTH WINDS SURVEYS AND GREG J. PETTIBONE, L.S.

Summary:

On October 30, 2011, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions received a Report of Alleged Violation regarding Mr. Pettibone and his surveying practices with relation to survey work performed in Sherman County, Kansas for KanSun Feeders, LLC. The report alleged the following deviations from accepted land surveying standards and/or the minimum standards for boundary surveys:

A. All of the corner reference reports prepared by respondents were left blank on that portion of the report which request-

ed a "detailed method of recovery or establishment";

B. Failure to provide an explanation or note as to why or what was used to determine that various corners were obliterated;

- C. Failure to identify monuments found and used outside the survey to verify occupation;
- D. Failure to comply with the provisions of K.S.A. 58 -2011 and the requirements for the filing of corner reference reports.

Board Action:

Following the completion of an investigation, the Board and the respondents resolved the matter by way of a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order. In that agreement, the respondents admitted that they had failed to file 37 corner reference reports as required by the provisions of K.S.A. 58-2011 and further had failed to indicate with regard to the surveys performed the detailed method of recovery or establishment of various corners.

Respondents further agreed to the following:

1. The Respondents, North Winds Surveys and Greg J. Pettibone shall, within sixty (60) days of the entry into this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order, prepare and cause to be filed the 37 missing corner reference reports which shall contain a detailed explanation of the method of recovery or establishment of the corners at issue.

2. Respondents shall provide written proof that the corner reference reports have been filed with the Kansas State Historical Society and the County Surveyor's Office.

3. Respondents shall pay all expenses of the Board including attorney and investigative fees in the amount of \$3,463.05 and a fine in the amount of \$1,536.95 for a total costs and fine of \$5,000 with said amount to be paid to the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions no later than June 15, 2012.

Status:

Respondents have fully complied with all of the terms and conditions of the Settlement Agreement and Consent Order in this matter and the case file has been closed.

IN THE MATTER OF SURVEY LAND EXPRESS, INC., UNLICENSED

Summary:

In June 2011, it came to the attention of the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions that a company in Atlanta Georgia by the name of Survey Land Express, Inc. was offering to provide land surveying services in numerous states in the United States, including the State of Kansas. A check of the Kansas Board's records relating to the licensure of land surveyors in Kansas and/or the issue of Certificate of Authorization for land surveying entities in the State of Kansas revealed that Land Survey Express did not hold a license or a Certificate of Authorization to practice land surveying in Kansas.

Board Action:

As a result of learning of the violation of the Kansas statutes relating to the practice of land surveying in the State of Kansas, the Board notified the respondents of their unlawful activities and attempted to resolve the matter by way of a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order. The respondents refused to resolve the matter by way of a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order and as a result thereof, the Board filed a formal complaint against Survey Land Express, Inc., alleging their unlawful practice of surveying in the State of Kansas. The matter was scheduled for a hearing and on the date of said hearing neither a representative nor attorney for Survey Land Express appeared for the hearing. Following a default hearing before a panel of the Board, it was determined that the respondents had engaged in the unlawful practice of land surveying in the State of Kansas without a license or Certificate of Authorization and took the following action:

1. Respondents were ordered to immediately cease and desist from the unlawful practice of land surveying in the State of Kansas.

2. Respondents were ordered to immediately remove from its website any reference to or indication that it is practicing, offering to practice or holding itself out as authorized to practice land surveying in the State of Kansas.

3. Respondents were to pay all expenses of the Board, including attorney fees and investigation fees incurred in the total amount of \$5,000.00.

Status:

Survey Land Survey Express, Inc. has failed and refused to comply with the terms and conditions of the Order of the panel and as a result the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions has contacted the Board in Georgia and has advised them of the unlawful practice of Survey Land Express, Inc. in the State of Kansas and has requested that the Georgia Board take whatever action they deem appropriate with regard to Survey Land Express, Inc.'s continued practice of land surveying in the State of Georgia.

IN THE MATTER OF STEPHEN P. MASLAN, P.E.

Summary:

On September 20, 2011, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions received a letter from Roger D. Williams of the Salina, Kansas Fire Department in which he voiced numerous concerns regarding plans and specifications for a fire detection and alarm system to be installed in a building in Salina, Kansas which had been prepared and signed off on by Stephen P. Maslan, a Kansas licensed engineer. As a result of that letter, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions had the matter investigated by one of its licensed engineering investigators, with a specialization in fire dynamics.

Board Action:

Following the completion of an investigation, the Board's Complaint Committee determined that Mr. Maslan had deviated from generally accepted engineering practices in the following respects:

1. The wiring and riser diagram submitted did not match the floor plan.

2. Installation details and mounting requirements were not indicated.

3. The drawings did not indicate monitoring of the fire sprinkler system.

4. Full smoke detection appeared to be shown for the building, however, the room in the northwest corner of the building, room just west of this space that has the annunciator panel, restrooms and the room near the center of the building are all missing detectors.

5. The smoke detector located in a large room on the west side of the building is over spaced per NFPA 72 requirements.

6. The smoke detector located in what appeared to be the sanctuary is over spaced per NFPA 72 requirements to some corners of the room.

7. The air handling unit monitoring or shut down was not mentioned on the submittal. There is not sufficient information to verify duct detectors were not required for air handling units exceeding 2,000 cfm per the international mechanical code (IMC).

8. Only one audible notification appliance was shown on the drawings. This did not meet the requirements of NFPA 72 requirements for audibility throughout all spaces.

9. The visible notification coverage could not be confirmed per NFPA 72 requirements for all spaces without room names or uses being shown.

10. Product data included phone jacks, however,

none were shown or indicated on the drawings.

11. Product data included door holders, however, these were not shown on the floor plan but only in the legend.

12. Three horn/strobes were listed in the product data, but only one was shown on the drawings.

13. The lack of information regarding the fire alarm submittal was insufficient per the City and code requirements.

With regards to the second project that Mr. Maslan had been involved in, the investigation determined the following:

1. The wiring and riser diagram was missing.

2. Installation details and mounting requirements were not indicated.

3. Notification appliances were missing from the count/ cash rooms, lounge space, and hallway near lounge/janitor's area.

4. A pull station was not located near the main entrance/vestibule area or in the sprinkler/electrical room, but at all other exits.

5. Air handling unit monitoring or shut-down was not mentioned on the submittal. There was not sufficient information to verify duct detectors are not required for air handling units exceeding 2000 cfm per the IMC.

6. Monitor modules and an annunciator were submitted with the product data, but not indicated on the drawings.

7. Two smoke detectors were included in battery calculations, but only one is shown on the drawings.

8. Four monitor modules were included in battery calculations, but none are shown or referenced on the drawing.

9. A total of 21 notification appliances were included in the battery calculations, but only 20 appear to be shown on the drawings.

10. The lack of information regarding the Big Lots store submittal was insufficient per the City and code requirements.

Following an unsuccessful attempt to resolve the matter by way of a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order, the Complaint Committee directed that the matter be set for a formal hearing. Following the hearing, the panel determined that Mr. Maslan's actions constituted gross negligence, incompetency, misconduct and/or a wanton disregard for the rights of others in his practice of the technical profession of engineering. As a result of said determination, the panel further ordered that Mr. Maslan pay the Board's costs and expenses in the total amount of \$25,000.

Status:

As of this date, Mr. Maslan has failed, refused and neglected to pay the fine and expenses in this matter.

Disciplinary Action, continued

IN THE MATTER OF ARC DESIGN AND DAVID KENDZIERSKI, UNLICENSED

Summary:

In July 2011, the Board received a Report of Alleged Violation form which indicated that ARC Design and David Kendzierski had performed certain architectural work in Scott City, Kansas by preparing plans and specifications for two businesses. As a result of that report, the Complaint Committee of the Board assigned the matter to one of its licensed architect investigators for the purpose of conducting an investigation.

Board Action:

Following the completion of an investigation, the Board's Complaint Committee determined that ARC Design and David Kendzierski had engaged in the unlicensed practice of architecture in the preparation of the plans and specifications for said businesses.

As a result of the foregoing determination, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions, ARC Design and David Kendzierski entered into a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order which included the following:

1. Respondents shall immediately cease and desist from practicing, offering to practice or holding themselves out as authorized to practice the technical professions of architecture and/or engineering in the State of Kansas until such time as they have been licensed or have obtained a Certificate of Authorization to do so.

2. Respondents shall pay a fine plus all expenses of the Board, including fees and investigative expenses incurred by the Board in the investigation and prosecution of this matter in the total amount of \$5,000.

Status:

The Kansas State Board of Technical Professions agreed to allow ARC Design and David Kendzierski to pay the fine and costs in installments and they are current on those payments.

IN THE MATTER OF JAMES F. SULLIVAN, ARCH.

Summary:

Mr. Sullivan is a licensed architect in the State of Kansas, however, he is not licensed to practice engineering in the State of Kansas. While engaged in the practice of architecture in the State of Kansas, Mr. Sullivan prepared a set of engineering and architectural plans and specifications for a restaurant in Johnson County, Kansas. In addition to the preparation, sealing and signing of nine sheets of architectural plans and specifications, he also prepared and sealed with his architectural seal ten separate sheets of structural, plumbing, mechanical, electrical and lighting plans and specifications without benefit of licensure. None of those ten sheets had been signed or sealed by a licensed engineer authorized to practice engineering in the State of Kansas. By preparing and/or signing and sealing the ten (10) sheets of engineering plans and specifications, the Respondent undertook to perform and performed work involving the practice of engineering when he was not licensed to do so.

Board Action:

Following the completion of an investigation the Board determined that Mr. Sullivan had engaged in the unlicensed practice of engineering. As a result of that determination, the Board and Mr. Sullivan entered into a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order which included the following provisions:

1. Respondent agreed that he will never again sign, seal or design engineering plans and specifications for any project including, but not limited to electrical, mechanical, structural, plumbing or lighting plans or specifications.

2. Respondent further agreed to pay a fine and the Board's expenses incurred in the investigation and prosecution in the total amount of \$40,000, which shall be paid to the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions in full at the time the Respondent signs and submits this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order to the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions for its consideration and approval.

3. The Respondent agreed to immediately cease and desist from practicing, offering to practice or holding himself out as authorized to practice the technical profession of engineering in the State of Kansas.

Status:

James F. Sullivan has fully complied with all of the terms and conditions of the Settlement Agreement and Consent Order in this matter and the case file has been closed.

NCARB Annual Meeting

The 93rd annual meeting of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards was held last June 20 through June 23 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Delegates from 53 of the 54 Member State Registration Boards were represented at the meeting and conference. Representing the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions were architect members Dave Hoffman, FAIA and Vince Mancini, AIA; Land Surveyor

Board Member Tim Sloan, L.S.; Jean Boline, Executive Director and Mary Leigh Dyck, Assistant Director.

We attended three workshops where we learned how changes to the Intern Development Program (IDP) are made, how the NAAB accreditation process of architecture schools affects the licensure process and how advances in the NCARB's database are providing facts about the Architecture profession. A new booklet titled "NCARB By The Numbers" provides answers from their database to questions about the profession, licensure and certification. See the NCARB web site, <u>www.ncarb.org/About-NCARB/NCARB-by-the-Numbers.aspx</u>, for this booklet.

Michael Armstrong, NCARB's new CEO, gave an overview of this past year's activities and noted how the council has worked to strengthen relationships across the profession, moving toward a more strategic culture and making a commitment toward transparency and open communication. Both he and past president Scott Veazey commented on the successful implementation of IDP 2.0, noting the improvement of the new reporting system and the greater flexibility in acquiring hours. Also mentioned was the importance of the 2012 Practice Analysis survey which has yielded over two million distinct data points and which will be used to drive future development of the IDP and the Architectural Registration Examination (ARE). The survey was sent to 74,000 people and yielded 7,900 responses. A final report on the survey will be issued later this year.

Summary of votes on Resolutions:

Twelve Resolutions were brought before the Delegates and the following ten were moved forward for consideration. All ten resolutions were noncontroversial and passed 52-0.

Resolutions 01 thru 06: Bylaw Amendments

Resolution 07: Legislative Guidelines, Model Law and Model Regulations Amendment -Broadening Legislative Guideline III to include Misconduct in Connection with the ARE and IDP.

Resolution 08: Legislative Guidelines, Model Law and Model Regulations Amendment – Broadening Model Regulation and the Rules of Conduct to Include Verification of Qualifications in Connection with the Intern Development Program.

Resolutions 10 & 11: Handbook for Interns and Architect Amendment – Provided correction of Canadian Intern Architect Reference and Canadian Examination Requirement.
