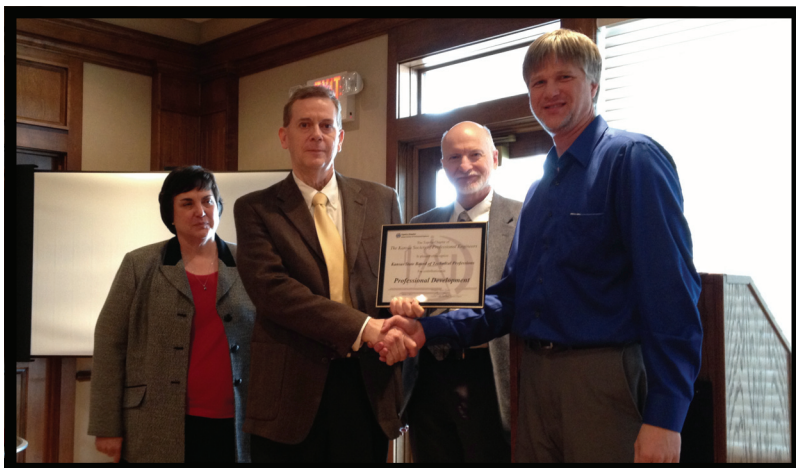

Disciplinary Action Taken by the Board

IN THE MATTER OF T. WAYNE FISCH, L.S.

Summary:

In October 2011, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions received a Report of Alleged Violation from one of its licensed surveyors. In that report, the reporting individual indicated that the respondent had prepared a land survey reference report relating to a land survey that he had prepared relating to the west quarter section corner of section 34, township 30S, range 33W in Haskell County, Kansas. According to the reporting party, said reference report required that the surveyor set forth in the report the "detailed method of recovery or establishment" and that in response to that requirement, the respondent indicated "???" The reporting party also indicated that at or about the same time the respondent prepared a second land survey reference report for the NW section corner of section 34, township 30S, range 33W and, once again, in that portion of the report entitled "detailed method of recovery or establishment", it was again indicated "???". Additionally, the reporting party indicated that the respondent had prepared a third land survey reference report relating to the SW section corner of section 34, township 30S, range 33W and yet again indicated in response to the section entitled "detailed method of recovery or establishment" answered "???". Finally, the reporting party indicated that the respondent had prepared a fourth land survey reference report relating to work performed with regard to the NW section corner, section 3, township 31S, range 33W and filled in on the report where it requires that the land surveyor provide the "detailed method of recovery or establishment" "beats me".

As a result of the foregoing, the Complaint Committee of the Board conducted further inquiry into the matter and learned that the four land survey reference reports at issue had been prepared by an employee working under Mr. Fisch's control and supervision and that employee had placed thereon the indications "???" and "beats me". The investigation also established that Mr.

Fisch had sealed and signed the four reports as prepared without noting and correcting the responses which had been placed thereon by the employee and then caused them to be filed with the Haskell County, Kansas Register of Deeds.

Board Action:

The Board and Mr. Fisch resolved the matter by way of a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order which contained the following terms of settlement:

1. Mr. Fisch admitted that he had deviated from acceptable land surveying practices and/or the minimum standards for boundary surveys in the preparation and filing of the four land survey reference reports referred to above.
2. He will forthwith correct all reference reports which were determined to be insufficient by the Board.
3. He will forward to the Board office all reference reports filed by him for each month commencing with any reports filed by him during the month of October 2012 through the month of September 2013.
4. Mr. Fisch shall pay all expenses of the Board including attorney fees in the amount of \$1,679.02 and investigation costs in the amount of \$3,320.98 incurred in the investigation and prosecution of this matter for a total amount of \$5,000.00.

Status:

Mr. Fisch has paid the fine and costs. He must file reference reports through September 2013.

IN THE MATTER OF TOM TINDLE, UNLICENSED

Summary:

In December 2011, the Complaint Committee of the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions received a Report of Alleged Violation from a Kansas licensed

landscape architect who also served as Chairman of the Planning Commission for the City of Fairway, Kansas. According to that individual, the City of Fairway requires that the stamp of a Kansas licensed professional architect or engineer be included on all submittals to the City for consideration by the Planning Commission. The packet of information that had been submitted for consideration by the City included a set of plans which appeared to have been stamped and signed by an architect registered in the State of Kansas. It was subsequently learned, however, that the stamp which appeared on the plans submitted to the City of Fairway had been cut out of a set of plans sealed by a Kansas licensed architect, placed on the plans that were being submitted to the City of Fairway, copied and then submitted in support of the project that was to be considered by the Planning Commission.

Board Action:

Following an investigation and an interview of the Kansas licensed architect whose seal and signature appeared on the plans, it was determined that the Kansas licensed architect had no knowledge of the preparation of the plans, nor had he authorized the use of his seal or signature on said plans.

As a result of the foregoing determination, the Kansas State Board of Technical Professions determined that Tom Tindle, who owned and operated a home improvement service in Johnson County, Kansas had practiced, offered to practice or held himself out as authorized to practice architecture in the State of Kansas without benefit of licensure. As a result of that determination, the Board and Mr. Tindle entered into a Settlement Agreement and Consent Order which included the following:

Tom Tindle acknowledged that he prepared architectural plans and specifications for the property located in Fairway, Kansas. He further admitted and acknowledged that, in order to comply with the City's requirement that the stamp of a Kansas licensed professional architect or engineer must be included on all submittals to the City for consideration by the Planning Commission, he removed the architectural seal of a Kansas licensed architect from a previous submittal to the City of Fairway Planning Commission and placed the same on the plans and specifications for the residence at issue.

Mr. Tindle shall pay the Board's investigative expenses and costs incurred in the prosecution of this matter in the amount of \$4,898.37 and a fine in the amount of \$101.63 for a total fine and costs of \$5,000 with \$3,000 of said amount to be paid forth-

with and the balance to be paid in monthly payments.

Tom Tindle shall immediately cease and desist from engaging or holding himself out as authorized to engage in the practice of architecture in the State of Kansas without first being licensed to do so.

Status:

Mr. Tindle paid \$3,000 at the time the Settlement Agreement and Consent Order was entered into and was to commence \$100 per month payments on April 1, 2013. He is current in his payments to the Board.



Statute Revision Update

Senate Bill 54, the comprehensive revision of the Board's licensing statutes, was introduced in the Senate and referred to the Senate Federal and State Affairs Committee on January 22, 2013. There was opposition to the "ethical marketing" definition. The Board agreed to have that section of the bill pulled out and placed in a separate bill, SB 155. This was done with the understanding that the Board and others representing the professional societies would work with the opponents in the interim and try to work out compromise language that would be acceptable to all.

As SB 54 was ready to be discussed on the floor of the Senate, the Board was made aware of possible amendments that were going to be proposed. An attempt was made to reach a compromise on the issues. No compromise had been reached by the end of the current session. The bill has been rereferred to the Senate Federal and State Affairs Committee.

Both SB 54 and SB 155 will be heard next January in the Federal and State Affairs Committee.

Time will be spent during the upcoming months working on both of these issues with the intent of having them passed during the 2014 legislative session.

Wendy Ornelas Earns Distinguished Professor Award



Wendy Ornelas (above, left), Architect, Board Member, was presented the prestigious Distinguished Professor award from the Association of Collegiate Schools of Architecture (ACSA) at their annual meeting March 22, 2013 in San Francisco. This award recognizes sustained creative achievement in the advancement of architectural education through teaching, design, scholarship, research or service.

Ms. Ornelas is associate dean of architecture in the Kansas State University College of Architecture, Planning and Design. She has been with the University since 1989. Tim de Noble, dean of the College of Architecture, Planning and Design, said "Professor Ornelas has guided our students to and through meaningful internship experiences throughout the nation and world."

NCARB Joint Regional Meeting

In preparation for the upcoming Annual NCARB meeting in June, Dave Hoffman, FAIA, and Vince Mancini, AIA, Architect members of the Board and Jean Boline, Executive Director, attended the NCARB Joint Regional meeting in Charleston, South Carolina March 7-9, 2013. Also in attendance were Board Members and Executive Directors from Region 3 Southern Conference, Region 4 Mid-Central States and other Region 5 Central States.

Dale Atkinson was an interesting speaker at the conference. As an attorney representing various state boards and associations, he gave examples of court cases involving licensure laws and state board regulatory authority.

NCARB President Ron Blich, FAIA and NCARB CEO Mike Armstrong gave updates on the Practice Analysis Survey of the architecture profession, the NCARB Strategic Plan and

the drafts of resolutions to be acted upon at the Annual NCARB meeting next June. Also mentioned was the eight week blackout in July-August 2013, when scheduling of the ARE exam will not be allowed (due to consultant transition from Prometric to Alpine Testing Solutions for the ARE Exam content and candidate management). Because of the blackout, candidates will not be able to take or schedule exams, NCARB will grant an automatic 12-week extension to the rolling clock after the blackout.

CEO, Mike Armstrong spoke about efforts to improve NCARB efficiency, efforts to control costs and efforts to improve service to the member boards. He mentioned:

- 1) restructuring staff job descriptions to better tie them to the NCARB Strategic Plan and better service to Member Boards
- 2) reduction in the number of major meetings with Member Board participation from 4 to 3, for savings in meeting travel expense and meeting time efficiency
- 3) development of conference facilities at NCARB in Washington, D.C., for savings on major meeting expense and travel expense.

He also reported on the financial health of NCARB (income ahead of budget and expenses below budget).

Regions 3, 4 and 5 held separate meetings to conduct individual regional business. During our Region 5 meeting we reviewed the 2013 resolutions A-G, to be voted upon at the annual meeting next June. Resolution "G" covers the "Mutual Recognition Agreement Between the National Council Of Architectural Registration Boards and The Canadian Architectural Licensing Authorities". This agreement is necessary to facilitate reciprocity between U.S. member board jurisdictions and Canadian jurisdictions as Canada will be using their own examination in lieu of the NCARB'S, ARE. These proposed Resolutions may be viewed at the NCARB web site www.ncarb.org. Additional information will be reported after the annual meeting in June.

After the proposed resolution review, Region 5 Director Dave Hoffman, FAIA, gave a report of NCARB activities at the Board of Directors level for the past year. Dave noted that he continues to see improvement in NCARB operations and transparency since the new CEO, Michael Armstrong, has come onboard. As we were advised that NCARB has proposed to fund future Joint Regional meetings, there will be a reason to restudy the Region 5 dues structure.

Following Mr. Hoffman's report, election of Region 5 officers was held. Elected officers for the coming year are:

NCEES Central/Southern Zone Joint Interim Meeting

The Central and Southern Zone states of the National Council of Examiners for Engineering and Surveying met April 4-6, 2013 in Biloxi, Mississippi. Representing the Kansas Board of Technical Professions were Tim Sloan, L.S.; Forrest Erickson, P.E.; Richard Hayter, P.E., George Barbee, Public Member; Jean Boline, Executive Director; and Mary Leigh Dyck, Assistant Director.

The majority of the time was spent in hearing updates from the NCEES officers, the Executive Director and members of NCEES committees. Each representative from an NCEES committee reported on the work of their respective committee to this point in the year and informed the group of any motions that the committee would be presenting at the Annual Meeting in August. Attendees were encouraged to discuss these issues and to ask questions. Board members in attendance are to report back to their state boards on these discussions so that all are well informed before voting at the Annual Meeting.

Major topics of discussion included computer based testing. The FE and FS exams will be computer based beginning in January 2014. The registration process for these exams was discussed in depth. The PE and PS exams will be computer based at some point in the future. Possible timelines and all that goes into this conversion were discussed at length. Also discussed were the industrial exemption, mobility, and public outreach.

All applications MUST be in the Board office and complete no later than June 15, 2013 to be considered for the October exam. 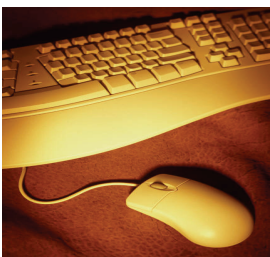
